





- screenings and assessments
- physical, occupational, speech and language therapy
- activities to develop: cognitive and self-help (adaptive skills) social/emotional development
- assistive technology
- transportation to services
- transition to school or other services as needed at age 3 or when graduating from the program
- nutritional services
- education and counseling
- coordination of social and health services (case management) needed by the child and family
- access to support groups

Services are delivered in accordance with a plan developed by the parents and the program staff.

- follows objects with eyes
- responds to loud sounds
- smiles
- makes cooing sounds

AT 6 MONTHS

- knows familiar faces
- plays with toes
- babbles
- sits with support

AT 12 MONTHS

- pulls to standing position
- crawls on hands and knees
- places tovs in a container
- savs one or two words

- pulls off shoes and socks
- stacks blocks
- turns the pages of a book
- walks without help
- follows simple directions

AT 2 YEARS

- says sentences
- recognizes pictures
- plays alone
- identifies parts of a face

AT 3 YEARS

- rides a tricycle
- opens doors
- is toilet trained
- hops on one foot
- plays with other children

- needed
- Special education school services beginning on date of child's third birthday, if eligible
- Activities to develop cognitive, self-help, social/emotional, motor, communications, and academic skills
- Services, such as, speech/language therapy, occupational therapy, counseling, transportation, audiology, and visual intervention as needed

The Special Education department is responsible for identifying, locating, and evaluating students with disabilities (birth through twenty-one years of age).

Special education offers a wide range of instructional options through services designed to meet the unique educational needs for students with disabilities. These options include specially designed instruction provided in a special education program or regular education program with modification, special education support, supplementary aids, and other special arrangements.
