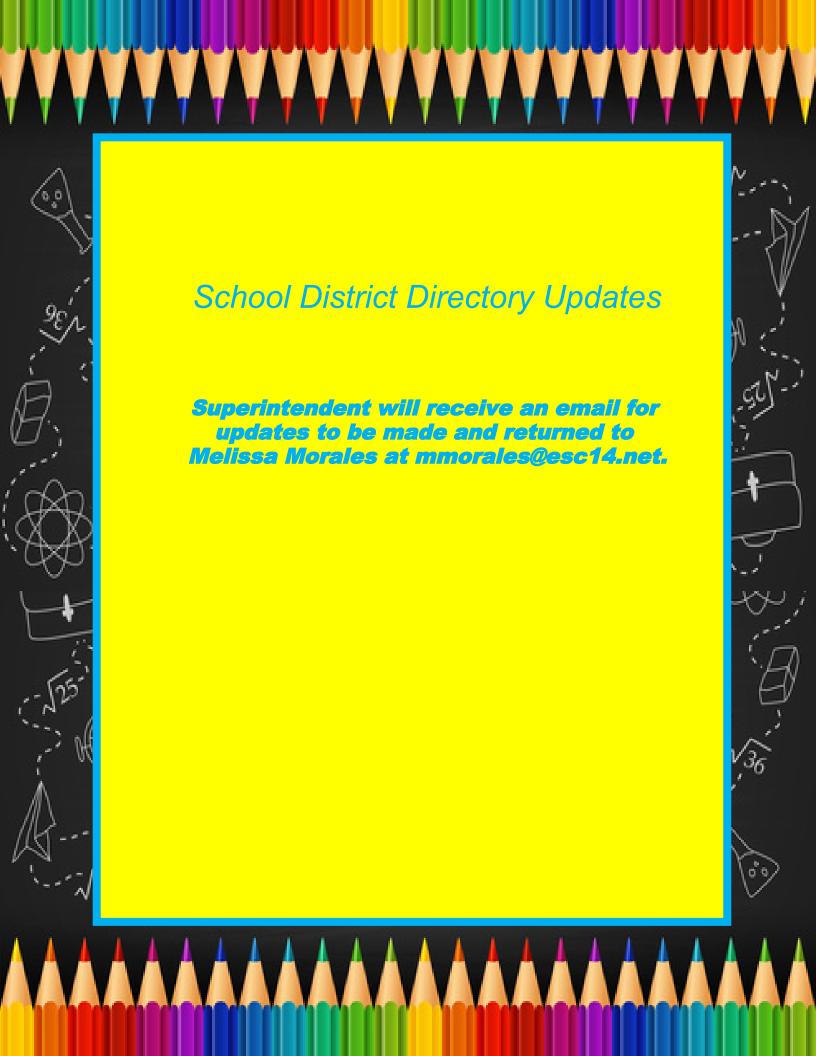

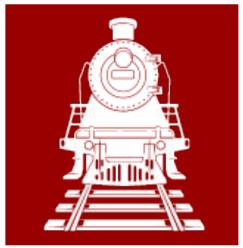

SB 11 By Taylor signed – 6-6-19

Relating to policies, procedures, and measures for school safety and mental health promotion in public schools.

- Section 10 Bill adds to a School District's Multihazard emergency operations plan to ensure a district's facility is able to provide communication technology to all teachers (including substitutes) in an emergency.
- Multihazard plans have greater consequences for not being complete or corrected.
- Section 13 Bomb or Terroristic Threat received triggers notification of parent/guardian as soon as possible.
- Threat Assessment Team creation
- Section 21 Adds retrofitting of school busses to acceptable issues to be bonded.
- Section 25 Creates Commissioner Grant Program for School Safety

S.B. 64 By Nelson signed – 6-6-19

Relating to Cybersecurity for information resources.

- Most of this bill will never effect LEAs or ESCs.
- Adds cybersecurity event to the definition of disaster
- Section 10 of the bill establishes the opportunity for State, Local Government and Private entities to share information regarding cybersecurity threats, best practices, and remediation strategies.
- LBB will be (by October 1 of even-numbered years) conducting a report on cybersecurity projects and modernizing legacy systems.
- A state agency is required to report by the 10th Business day after the date of the eradication, closure, and recovery from a breach, suspected breach, or unauthorized exposure to the Department of Information (DIR). This report will include details of the event and include an analysis of the cause of the event.
- Creates the Cyberstar Program- to recognize public and private entities that implement the best practices for cybersecurity developed in accordance with program expectations.

S.B. 820 By Nelson signed – 6-10-19

Relating to a requirement that a school district develop and maintain a cybersecurity framework.

- Defines within the Education Code
- Breach of system security as an incident in which student information that is sensitive, protected, or confidential. As provided by state or federal law, is stolen or copied, transmitted, viewed, or used by a person unauthorized to engage in that action.
- Cyber Attack as an attempt to damage, disrupt, or gain unauthorized access to a computer, computer network, or computer system.
- Cybersecurity as the measures taken to protect a computer, computer network, or computer system against unauthorized use or access.

H.B. 3834 By

Relating to the requirement that certain state and local government employees and state contractors complete a cybersecurity training program certified by the Department of Information Resources.

- A focus on forming information security habits and procedures that protect information resources; and
- teach best practices for detecting, assessing, reporting, and addressing information security threats.
- employees who use a computer to complete at least 25 percent of the employee 's required duties. At least once each year, an employee identified by the agency.

Compliance communication from TEA:

As you may be aware, there are two statutes which passed the 86th legislature and were signed by the Governor which impact school districts regarding cybersecurity. The following information may be helpful when you are working with the school districts.

SB820 contains four major components for compliance:

- 1) Each school district shall adopt a cybersecurity policy to secure the district infrastructure against cyber-attacks and determine cybersecurity risk and implement mitigation planning. The cybersecurity policy may not conflict with information standard for institutions of higher education adopted by the Texas Department of Information Resources under chapters 2054 and 2059 of the Government Code. The information standard for institutions of higher education is commonly referred to as the Texas Cybersecurity Framework, consisting of 40 cybersecurity objectives.
- 2) Each superintendent shall designate a cybersecurity coordinator as a liaison between the district and TEA on cybersecurity matters.
- 3) The district's cybersecurity coordinator shall report to TEA any cyber-attack or incident against the district's infrastructure which constitutes a breach of security as defined in the statute.
- 4) The district's cybersecurity coordinator shall provide notice to a parent of an enrolled student in the district of the cyber-attack which required a report to be submitted to TEA.

For SB820 compliance, I recommend school districts work with the Education Service Centers or vendors using the Texas Cybersecurity Framework to help establish a baseline of the cybersecurity posture of the school district's infrastructure. The baseline will help identify risks and develop a roadmap to implement mitigation.

Under HB3834, school districts are required to provide an annual cybersecurity training program which has been certified by the Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) to all employees who have access to a computer or database. Verification of completion of the cybersecurity training program shall be reported to DIR. Periodic audits are required to ensure compliance.

DIR is in the process of certifying cybersecurity programs but will probably not be completed prior to the start of the school year. I recommend that school districts who have currently purchased or have already been offering a security awareness training program, continue using the same program for the upcoming school year and then evaluate the best certified program for the district. School districts which are not currently providing an awareness program should consider waiting until DIR has finished the certification process and then evaluate the best certified program for the district.

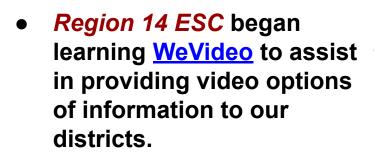

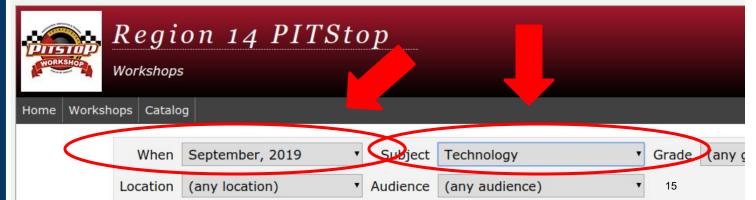

Funding Status – FY 2019

USAC released Wave 14 for FY 2019 on Thursday, July 25th. Funding totaled \$50.5 million. Cumulative commitments through Wave 14 are \$1.10 billion.

E-Rate Updates and Reminders

Upcoming E-Rate Dates:

July 29 Extended deadline (<u>DA 19-628</u>) for submitting comments to the FCC's NPRM (<u>FCC 19-46</u>) seeking comment on establishing a cap on total funding of the Universal Service Fund ("USF") (see our newsletter of <u>June 3rd</u>). Reply comments are due August 26th.

August 2 Form 486 deadline for FY 2018 funding committed in Wave 52. More generally, the Form 486 deadline is 120 days from the FCDL date or the service start date (typically July 1st), whichever is later. Other upcoming Form 486 deadlines are:

Wave 53 08/09/2019

Wave 54 08/16/2019

Note 1: Applicants missing any Form 486 deadline should watch carefully for "Form 486 Urgent Reminder Letters" in



their EPC News Feed. These Reminder Letters afford applicants 15-day extensions to submit their Form 486s without penalty. Note 2: The first Form 486 deadline for FY 2019, covering funding committed in Waves 1-10, will be October 29, 2019. August 5-9 USAC is holding two service provider training sessions in Washington DC, one at the beginning of the week (August 5-6) and one at the end of the week (August 8-9). Each two-day session will begin with a half-day presentation for beginners and will include a second full day for everyone. August 16 Deadline for submitting initial comments to the FCC's Notice of Proposed Rulemaking ("NPRM") on the future of Category 2 funding for FY 2020 and beyond (FCC 19-58). (See our newsletter of July 15th.) Reply comments are due by September 3rd.

September 16 See USAC's 2019 Training webpage for a schedule of all USAC 2019 fall – November 21 applicant and tribal training sessions.

EPC Portal Users:

USAC announced that beginning later this fall logins to <u>all</u>
USAC portals — including EPC — will begin using multi-factor authentication. To login, users will first enter their usernames (email addresses) and passwords as is currently required. The logins will then be subject to a second level of authentication



requiring users to either enter authentication codes (sent by email or text message) or to answer pre-established security questions. Presumably the additional authentication step is being added to cut down on the unauthorized sharing of user names and passwords. The downside, of course, is that the additional step will make EPC logins a bit slower and more burdensome.

What is E-rate?

E-rate: Universal Service Program for Schools and Libraries:

The FCC's E-rate program makes information services more affordable for schools and libraries. With funding from the Universal Service Fund, E-rate provides discounts for Internet access and internal connections to eligible schools and libraries. The ongoing proliferation of innovative digital learning technologies and the need to connect students, teachers and consumers to jobs, life-long learning and information have led to a steady rise in demand for bandwidth in schools and libraries. In recent years, the FCC refocused E-rate from legacy telecommunications services to broadband, with a goal to significantly expand Wi-Fi access. These steps to modernize the program are helping E-rate keep pace with the need for increased Internet access. Eligible schools and libraries may receive discounts on Internet access, as well as internal connections, managed internal broadband services and basic maintenance of internal connections. Discounts range from 20



to 90 percent, with higher discounts for higher poverty and rural schools and libraries. Recipients must pay some portion of the service costs.

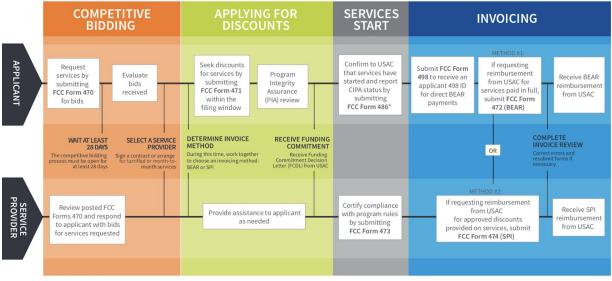

SERVICE PROVIDERS: Service providers must first obtain a Service Provider Identification Number (SPIN Jervice provider 498 ID) by submitting FCC Form 498.

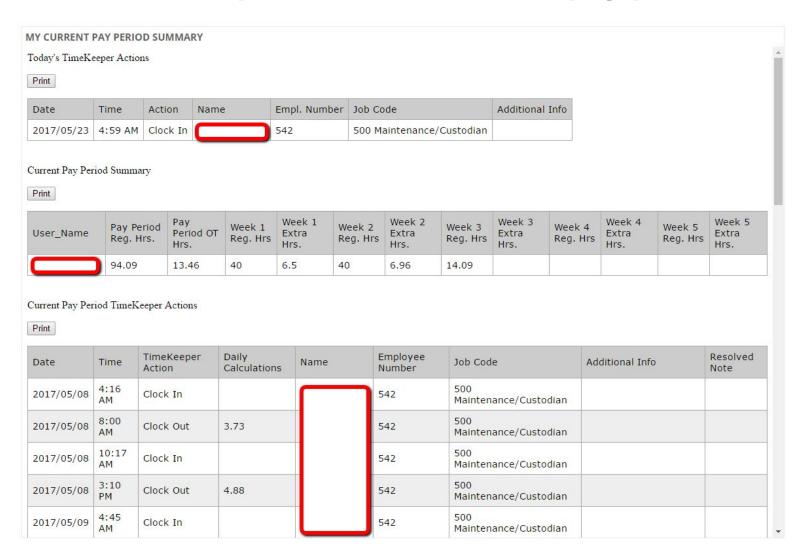

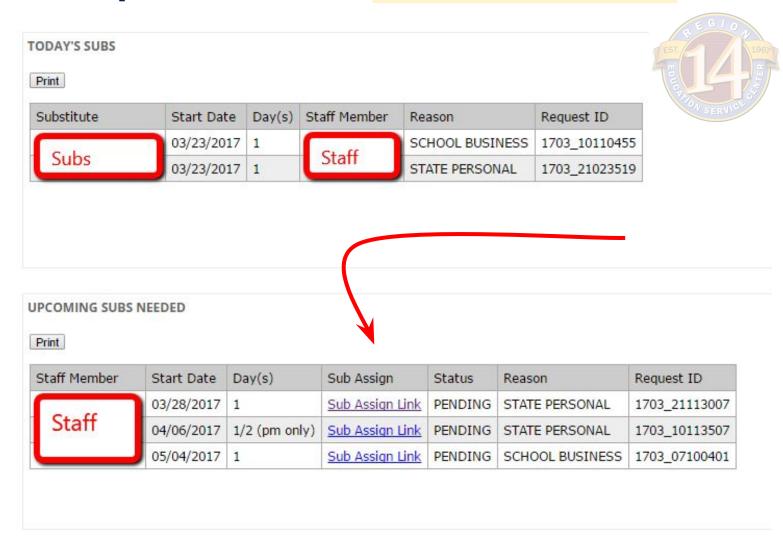

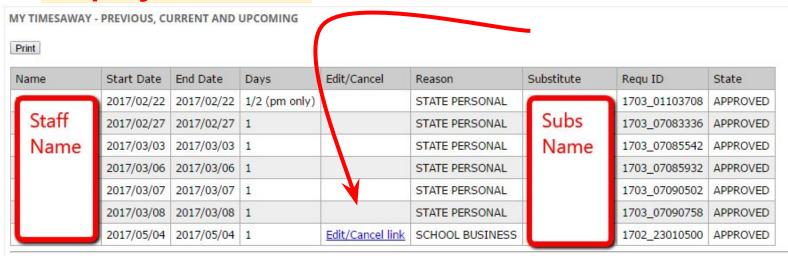

What is TSDS?

The Texas Student Data System is a suite of applications that will improve education data collection in the state of Texas, and equip educators with timely, actionable, and historical student data.

What is TEDS?

All validations used in TSDS are listed in the Texas Education Data Standards in Section 3 and 5. (TEDS)

What is TSDS Unique ID?

TSDS Unique ID is necessary in order to integrate the various subsystems of TSDS smoothly and accurately – it if better able to reduce duplicates and other errors than TEA's previous identification management system.

LEAs use Unique ID numbers to load student and staff information to the TSDS Education Data Warehouse (EDW). Each student and staff member will have a single <u>unique</u> <u>10-digit identifier</u> for his or her entire career within the Texas educational system (from early education programs through the twelfth grade). Individuals will retain the same unique identifier even if they leave the Texas education system and return years later or transition from being a student to a staff member.

All student/staff additions and changes must be made through Unique ID.

All LEAs must have UIDs for their students and staff to submit data for all collections.

calling the ESC and the problem is be escalated to TEA. TEA
requires a ticket system for workflow. The district must begin
the ticket and escalate the ticket to Level 2 (ESC), we then
escalate to Level 3 (TEA) for further assistance.

Pricing for TSDS

TEA set a standard price of \$21,280.00 for Region Centers to charge each district no matter the size. Region 14 worked hard to discount that price and use the ADA of our districts to customize the price for each district. Robb worked out a formula that is all inclusive of technical support and trainings that includes consultants traveling to districts to help as needed. When districts are not a part of our contracted services they are charged \$95.00 an hour for support and training. A workshop is 6 hours and would cost a district \$575.00 per person to attend.

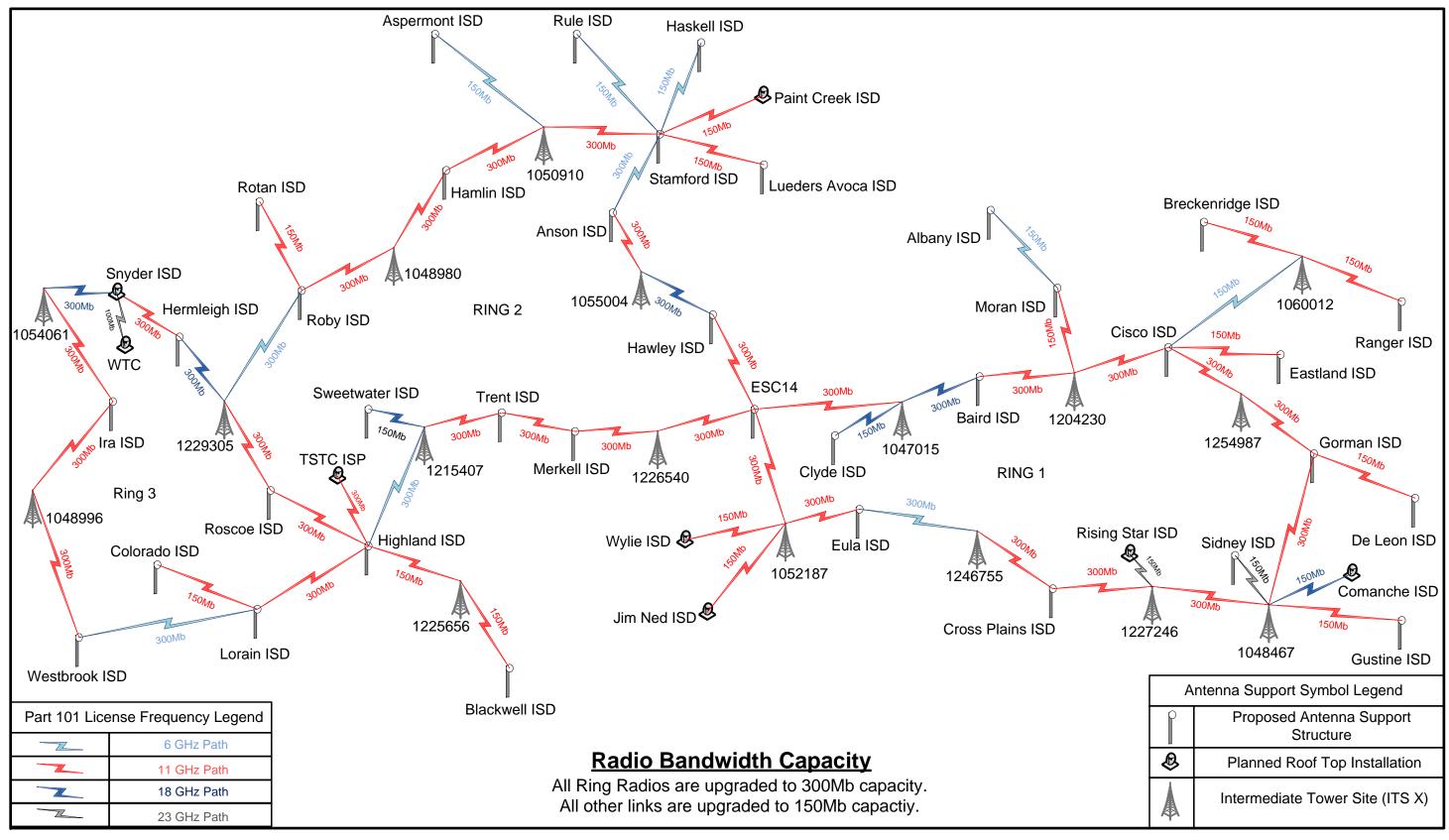

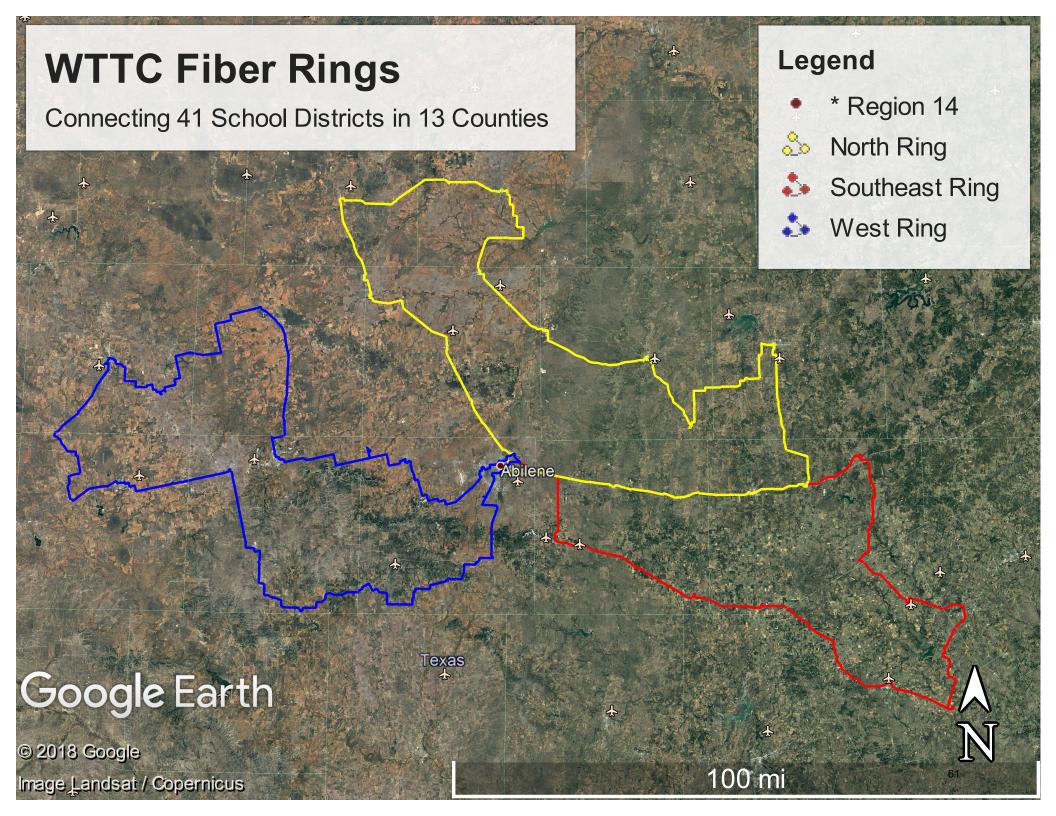

HB3 and Pre-K FAQs

What are the Pre-K requirements under House Bill 3? Is Pre-K funded for full day or half-day?

HB 3 provides for full day Pre-K for all eligible 4 year-old children. **Pre-K still only receives a half-day average daily attendance for Foundation School Program funding.** However, HB 3 enacted the Early Education Allotment which provides weighted funding for each student at the district in Kindergarten through third grade that also qualifies for the compensatory education or bilingual allotment.

HB3 and Pre-K FAQs

What are the Pre-K requirements under House Bill 3? Is Pre-K funded for full day or half-day?

HB 3 provides for full day Pre-K for all eligible 4 year-old children. **Pre-K still only receives a half-day average daily attendance for Foundation School Program funding.** However, HB 3 enacted the Early Education Allotment which provides weighted funding for each student at the district in Kindergarten through third grade that also qualifies for the compensatory education or bilingual allotment.

May a district request a waiver to either partially, or fully exempt them from providing a full-day prekindergarten to eligible four-year-olds?

Yes. A district may request an **exemption for up to three years**, which may only be renewed once. All districts that are unable to meet the full-day requirement for all eligible 4-year-old students **by September 1, 2019** must submit an exemption request.

John Wink currently serves as superintendent of schools for <u>Carthage Independent School District</u>. He previously served as superintendent of <u>Blue Ridge Independent School District</u> in Blue Ridge, TX where he has led since May 2016. In his time at Blue Ridge, student achievement saw tremendous gains, and the culture for learning transformed the hearts and minds of students, staff, parents, and the community at large. This district is on the cusp of being one of the high-performing districts in North Texas.

Prior to that, John served at the Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment for the <u>Tatum Independent School District</u> in Tatum, TX from 2014 to 2016. In his time there, student achievement increased significantly, and the district saw academic distinctions on standardized tests increase from 2 to 10 in one year and a significant increase in students earning dual credit hours and CTE workforce industry certifications.

HB3 and Prek FAQs

- 1. What are the Pre-K requirements under House Bill 3? Is Pre-K funded for full day or half-day?
 - In addition to other requirements addressed in a recent To the Administrator Addressed Letter, House Bill 3 provides for full day Pre-K for all eligible 4 year-old children.

Pre-K still only receives a half-day average daily attendance for Foundation School Program funding. However, House Bill 3 enacted the Early Education Allotment which provides weighted funding for each student at the district in Kindergarten through third grade that also qualifies for the compensatory education or bilingual allotment.

- 2. Is the full-day prekindergarten program effective this year or in a later school year?
 - The full-day prekindergarten program requirement for eligible four-year-olds will be effective September 1, 2019 with implementation in the 2019-2020 school year.
- 3. Does the full-day prekindergarten program requirement apply to all prekindergarten students?
 - No. The full-day prekindergarten program requirement applies to eligible four-year-olds.
- 4. May a district request a waiver to either partially, or fully exempt them from providing a full-day prekindergarten to eligible four-year-olds?
 - Yes. A district may request an exemption for up to three years, which may only be renewed
 once. All districts that are unable to meet the full-day requirement for all eligible 4-year-old
 students by September 1, 2019 must submit an exemption request.
- 5. If a district elects to request a waiver, when and through what process will that be available?
 - An exemption may be applied for through the State Waiver Unit. The prekindergarten exemption for full-day prekindergarten will be available in January.

- 6. How does full-day prekindergarten for eligible four-year-olds impact year-round schools?
 - Year-round schools would be subject to the same full-day prekindergarten for eligible fouryear-olds requirements and exemption process.
- 7. If a district begins offering a full-day prekindergarten for eligible four-year-olds and begins to see an influx of eligible four-year-olds wanting to enroll mid-year, is the district still required to serve all eligible four-year-olds?
 - Yes. The district would be required to serve all eligible four-year-olds. However, a district may
 request a full-day exemption if fewer eligible students would be served (typically due to
 physical capacity or personnel constraints).
- 8. If a district is providing full-day funding for eligible four-year-olds, are the minutes of operations for a full-day prekindergarten program 75,600?
 - Yes, if a district is providing a full-day prekindergarten program for eligible four-year-olds, the district would provide 75,600 operational minutes. This total may include recess, meals, intermission and rest time.
- 9. How is the full-day prekindergarten for eligible four-year-olds funded?
 - Districts will receive FSP funding for the first half of the day, as was the case before HB 3. As was also the case before HB 3, districts can devote other sources of funding (for example: compensatory education, Title I, or funding from tier II). With HB 3, districts will also receive the early education allotment, which may also be used to fund the second half of the day. Other increased funding from HB 3 may also be relevant.
- 10. Are districts required to use the early education allotment towards full-day prekindergarten? If a district has been funding full-day prekindergarten through local and federal funds, may they continue to do so?
 - If a district is supporting their full-day program with local or State Compensatory Education funds, they may continue to do so as long as the early allotment funds are being used to improve programs and services in language and mathematics for prekindergarten through third grade.

11. Can a district continue to use their Title I, Part A funds towards a full-day prekindergarten program or is that supplanting?

• Title I, Part A has a different definition of supplement/not supplant. As long as the LEA has an appropriate supplement/not supplant methodology implemented, then it would not be a supplanting to use Title I, Part A funds for full-day prekindergarten funding.

12. Can a district continue to partner with a Head Start or licensed child care to provide a full-day program and receive the early education allotment?

Yes. If a district has a partnership with a Head Start or licensed child care program, they may
continue to braid their half-day average daily attendance with Head Start and/or child care
funds. The early education allotment may be used to supplement quality improvement efforts
to meet the high-quality prekindergarten components.

13. What is the definition of a public meeting?

• To be considered a public meeting, the LEA must issue a public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the meeting.

14. May a district use the early education allotment to enroll non-eligible 3 and 4-year old's?

• Yes, if a district is providing full-day high quality prekindergarten to eligible four-year-olds, they may use any remaining funds to improve programs and services in PK-3.

15. If a district receives an exemption from providing full-day prekindergarten, will they still receive the early education allotment?

 Yes, a district will receive the early allotment for any purpose that supports eventual improvements in 3rd grade reading and mathematics proficiency, even if they receive an exemption from full-day prekindergarten.

16. Does Rider 78 exist beyond the 2018-2019 school year?

• No. The Rider was deleted in the appropriations bill of House Bill 1.

 17. Will the high-quality prekindergarten program requirements for full-day prekindergarten for eligible four-year-olds be the same as the former High-Quality Prekindergarten Grant? Yes, the high-quality components will be the same as the high-quality prekindergarten grant and Rider 78.
 18. Will eligible four-year-olds get coded as "02" in PEIMS C185 PK-PROGRAM-TYPE-CODE? Yes, eligible four-year-olds served in a full-day program will generate codes in PEIMS as "02".

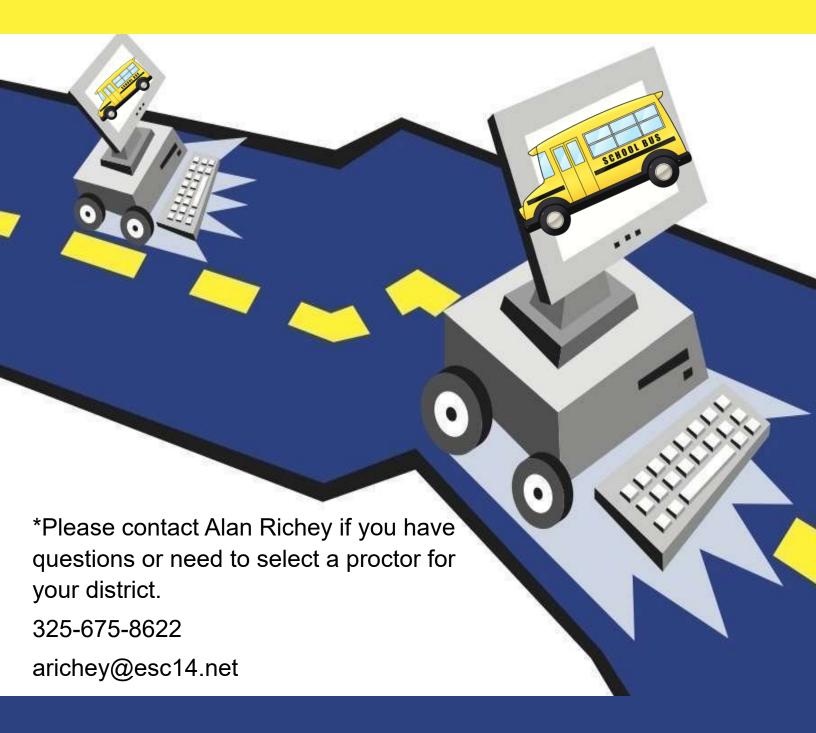

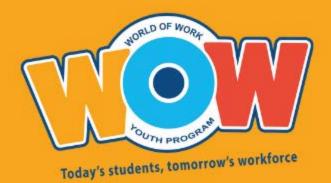

86th Legislative Highlights Special Education

What do we know???

<u>HB 3</u>

- Revised Special Education Mainstream Weight
 - Increase weight for students served in a mainstream setting
 - Remember-- Must continue to make decisions based on individual needs
- Autism Training Stipend/Bonus
 - Voluntary and unfunded
 - Training received through an ESC
- Special Education Allotment Advisory Committee
 - Work group to make recommendations regarding SPED funding
 - May have implications for next session
 - TAA letter- August 1st- nominations

SB 500

- Provides additional special education funding (\$61 million) to LEAs
- August 1st TAA letter provides guidance
- Amounts will be paid out by August 30, 2019

*****Additional \$50 million appropriated to reimburse LEA's for certain expenditures related to identifying and serving students with disabilities*****

- Not ALL LEA's will receive \$
- TEA will develop criteria for eligibility
- Money will come later

We will update you as we receive more guidance.

Other Bills to Review

HB 165

- Relating to providing for endorsements(with or without modified curriculum) for public high school students enrolled in special education programs
- ARD committee would authorize award of endorsements if curriculum, as modified, is sufficiently rigorous

HB 3630 / SB 712

- Relating to prohibiting the use of certain aversive techniques on students enrolled in public schools
- Applies to ALL students

SB 139

- Relating to notice of educational rights for certain student evaluations
- TEA will develop notice for distribution regarding rights of child under federal and state law and general process to initiate a referral for a Full Individual Initial Evaluation to determine special education eligibility

Special Education Monitoring Updates Division of Review and Support

- LEA's have been contacted if they were selected as part of the Year 1 or Year 2 Cyclical Monitoring activities.
- 10 districts within Region 14 were selected for review over the next 2 years
- Currently no onsite visits scheduled in our region
- 23 LEA's across the state selected for onsite visits
- Following release of RDA (PBMAS), anticipated 25 additional LEA's will be added to list
- Year 1, groups 1 and 2 will be test groups
 - Longer time to complete self-assessment
 - Provide feedback.
- CTL is ready to assist LEA's in any way that we can through this process

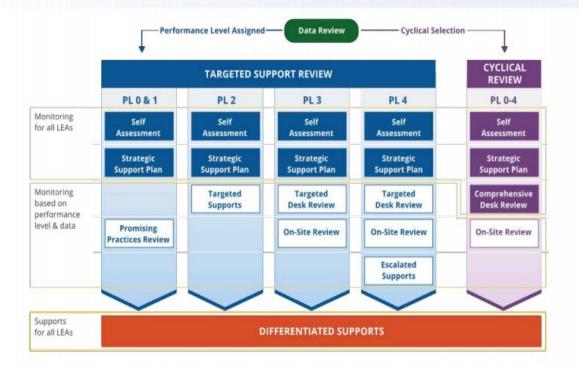

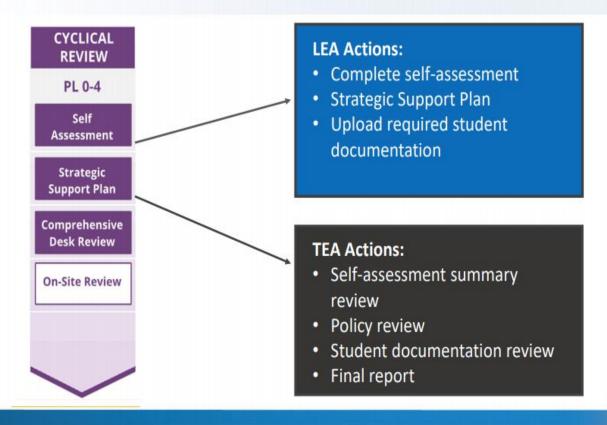


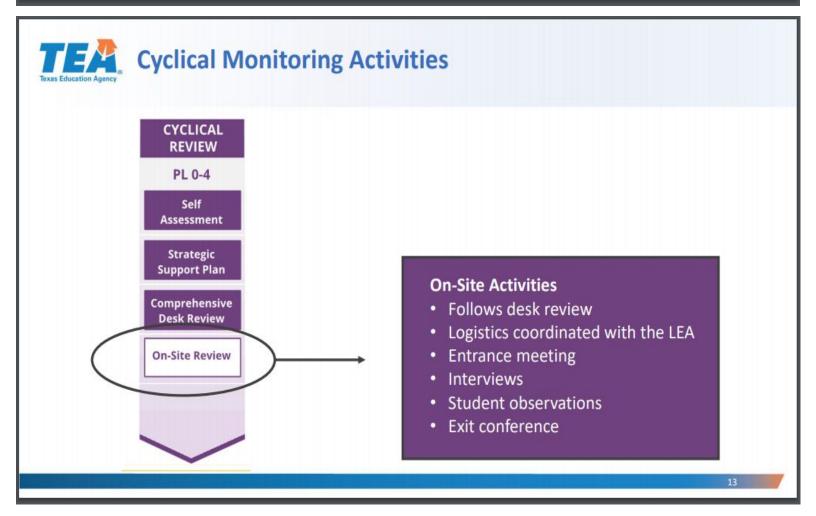
Differentiated Monitoring and Support





TEM Cyclical Monitoring Activities





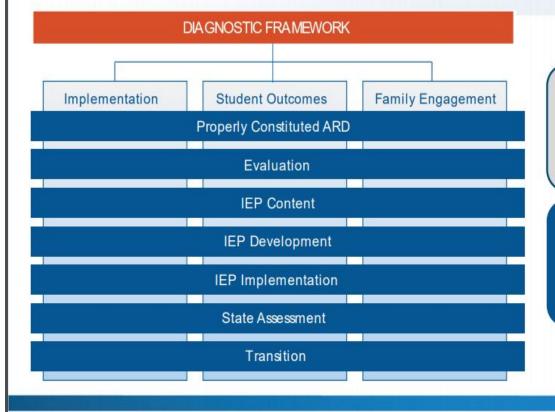


TEA Targeted Support Review





TEA Diagnostic Framework



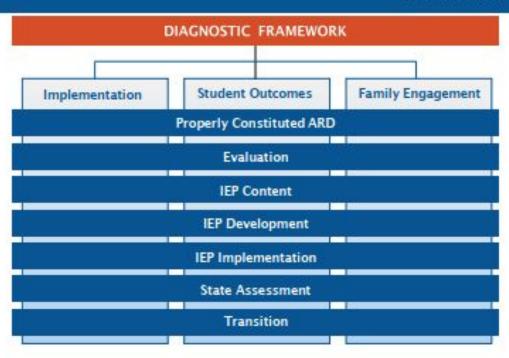

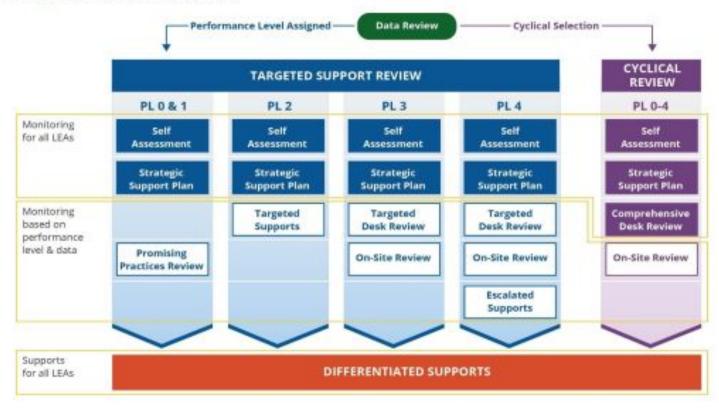
Differentiated Monitoring and Support



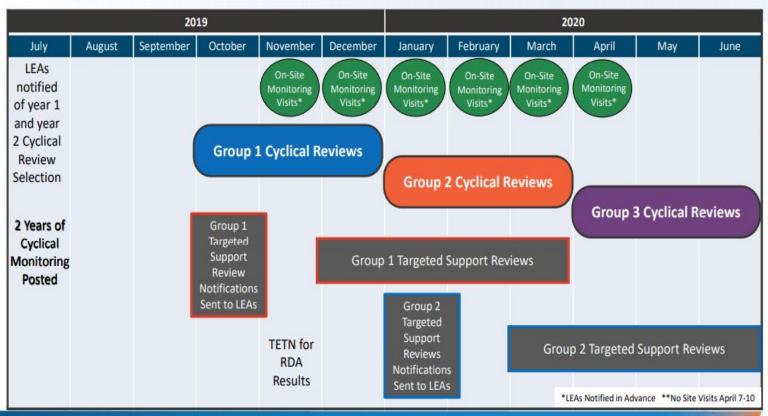
The Differentiated Monitoring and Support (DMS) diagnostic framework concentrates on three programmatic pillars: Implementation, Student Outcomes, and Family Engagement. These pillars are integral to the analysis of the seven critical areas of compliance within the monitoring framework. The diagnostic framework supports the TEA and LEAs in developing differentiated support activities to promote compliance and continuous improvement of outcomes for students with disabilities.



The DMS system consists of two types of special education program monitoring: Cyclical reviews and Targeted reviews. Cyclical reviews determine compliance with federal and state laws and assist LEAs in resolving specific issues or concerns that impact services and outcomes for students with disabilities. Targeted reviews determine compliance with federal and state laws and assist LEAs with performance level indicators that identify potential supports. LEA special education programs will participate in a Cyclical review every six years. LEAs will receive a Targeted review based on a review of compliance data and performance level determination. An LEA will not be monitored in more than one pathway within the same school year.

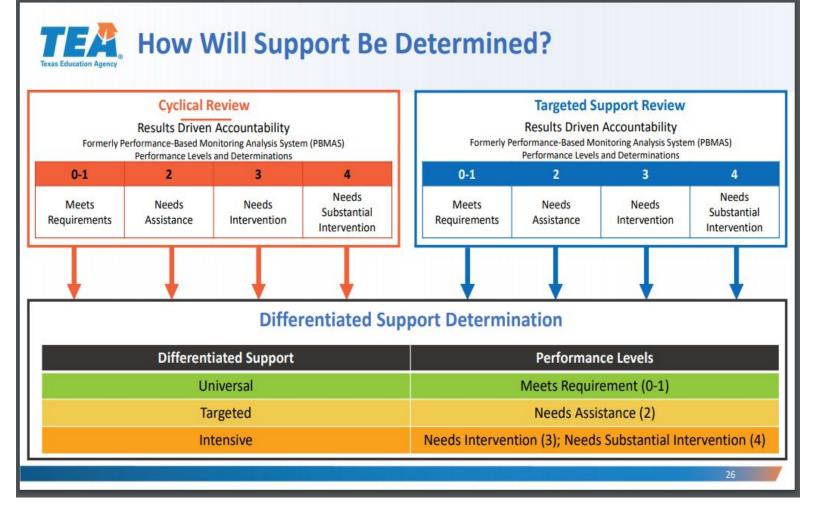
