# Approval of Minutes:

## **WAN Update:**

<u>Towers</u> - Mike stated that he has been talking to Conterra about the towers. Contract reads that towers belong to Conterra for 20 years and that they have liability on all of their equipment. Conterra has sold out to a company in Canada. Mike is waiting to hear back from Conterra with a contact person for each district to discuss towers located on district property.

<u>Generators</u> - Mike stated that there are 8 or 10 generators that are no longer needed and suggested school decide whether to keep them or not.

Fiber - Mike stated that fiber rings have been completed

<u>USAC Update:</u> Brit stated that the 470 window is open, but 471 window will not open until first of the year. He suggested districts reach out to him by phone, email, or district depot.

Mike stated USAC is working on getting past due amount paid.

Other: Robb stated that Information Security Coop meetings are underway with each district. Dontay is making sure all policies and procedures are updated with districts and working on getting cyber security contacts to insure higher scores for everyone. Information Station is available to each district. Tech personnel that handles security may subscribe to security option, where they will be able to see posted information, such as reported attacks. He stated that it is our goal to make sure policies and procedures are in place and taken care of before reporting to TEA. Senate Bill 3834 requires certified training which will be provided to Security Coop member through KnowBe4.
