Rules for Mandatory School Drills

As required by <u>TEC Sec. 37.114</u>, the Commissioner, in coordination with the Texas School Safety Center (TxSSC) and State Fire Marshal, has adopted <u>Rules for Mandatory School Drills</u> for public school districts and open-enrollment charter schools, **effective September 6, 2020**.
